



Introduction

This Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement relates to actions and activities during the year 1st January 2025 – 31st December 2025.

The statement sets down Happy Energy Solutions Ltd. commitment to preventing slavery and human trafficking in our business activities and the steps we have put in place with the aim of ensuring that there is no slavery or human trafficking in our own business and supply chains. We all have a duty to be alert to risks, however small. Staff are expected to report their concerns and management to act upon them.

Organisational structure and supply chains

This statement covers the business activities of Happy Energy Solutions Ltd. which are as follows:

Provision of energy efficiency / carbon saving grants to domestic holders. Grants provided by a range of commercial and non commercial organisations. Supply chain includes large providers of energy efficiency equipment and installation contractors.

Responsibility for the Company's anti-slavery initiatives is as follows:

- 1.1 Policies: the Chief Administration Officer is responsible for creating and reviewing policies.
- 1.2 Due diligence: Chief Operating Officer is responsible for due diligence in relation to known or suspected instances of modern slavery and human trafficking.

Training

To ensure a good understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our business and supply chains, the Company requires all staff to undertake a relevant on-line training course.

Policies

The Company is committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or

human trafficking in our business or our supply chains. This Statement affirms its intention to act ethically in our business relationships.

The following policies set down our approach to the identification of modern slavery risks and steps to be taken to prevent slavery and human trafficking in our operations:

- 2.1 **Whistleblowing Policy** - the Company encourages all its workers, customers and other business partners to report any concerns related to its direct activities or its supply chains.
- 2.2 **Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Policy** - The Company's CSR policy summarises how we manage our environmental impacts and how we work responsibly with suppliers and local communities.

Due Diligence Processes for Slavery and Human Trafficking

The Company undertakes due diligence when considering taking on new suppliers, and regularly reviews its existing suppliers. The Company's due diligence process includes building long-standing relationships with suppliers and making clear our expectations of business partners.
